typically enacted by the BOCC, wouldn't be able to be established in time, as the BOCC doesn't meet again until July 11. However, County Attorney Marti Whitmore said Mattivi as county fire marshal has the authority by statute to declare a fire ban.

"There's plenty of opportunity to take care of this, one way or another," she said.

In the meantime, Mattivi said he'll see what Friday's conference turns up and act accordingly.

Commissioner Ben Tisdell also shared Mattivi's concern for the fire risk.

"For the next 10-day forecast, there's no rain and some degree of wind," he said. "My fear is, between now and next meeting, conditions could be more fire prone."

On Wednesday morning, June 28, the Board of County Commissioners approved a resolution allowing for Mattivi to enact a county-wide fire ban if conditions worsen, which could possibly include a ban on fireworks for the July 4 festivities.
